EYFS

This week we have had an amazing 'Sparkly Start' where we learnt how to make our own slime with Atomic Tom! We have continued our learning about 'Meg and Mog' by looking at writing lists for making a potion. We have thought about colour mixing and capacity when making our own potions and discussed what a good instruction is. We have also begun to learn about teen numbers - please do practice these at home with your children!

Year 1

Year One have had a very exciting visit from the Peterborough Museum who brought along lots of wonderful toys from the past for us to explore. In English and History lessons we are focusing on toys so this has really helped us to understand more. We look forward to sharing some of our toy information texts that we will create soon!

Year 2

We have jumped right in to our 'All Dressed Up and ROARING to Go!' topic by meeting lots of unusual and exciting animals brought in by the Lion Learners! We saw a huge stripy frog, gave fluffy guinea pigs and a fat tailed gerbil a cuddle, got tickled by a giant millipede, held on to a snake and even gently stroked a bearded dragon and a gecko! It was really amazing to see how bright a scorpion lights up under the moon and how much like a leaf the leaf insects looked like! We discovered that animals have different types of body covering to protect them, keep them warm in cold climates and warn them of danger. We can't wait to continue learning about animals and their habitats.
