EYFS

EYFS have had a lovely week learning about our next Meg and Mog story - 'Meg on the Moon'. We have been revisiting speech bubbles and learning about thought bubbles. We have been using our acting skills to show what Meg and Mog could be thinking and what they would be saying during different parts of the story. In Maths we have been on our Learning Journey Bus to look at pictures of night and day and talk about the differences between these. We also had a great Happiness Day, making healthy tacos for Meg (and us!) to eat and some delicious looking salad bags.

Year 1

We began our new narrative unit this week on 'Toy Story', where we will be thinking about character descriptions. During our Knowledge Harvest, children were able to explain how writers describe characters according to their appearance and behaviour. They all knew that adjectives make stories more interesting to read! We have enjoyed making cheese scones for our first ever food fayre, a big thank you to Mrs Lemin for supporting all three classes with this!

Year 2

We have been practising how to safely use cutting skills in DT by using the claw grip to cut carrots, leeks, parsnips and spring onions and the bridge grip to slice tomatoes and onions. We used what we learnt to create healthy soup bags for the Food Fayre. The food theme doesn't end there! In preparation for learning about instructions in English we have been tasting Rainbow Couscous and evaluating the ingredients that were used. We tried some alternative ingredients and discussed how we could make our recipe even tastier!
